As organizations, all cook in the cultural context of their work, but none has the mission of feeding people as a central part of their mandate. Since March 2020, however, they have had to ramp up their response to the Covid crisis. 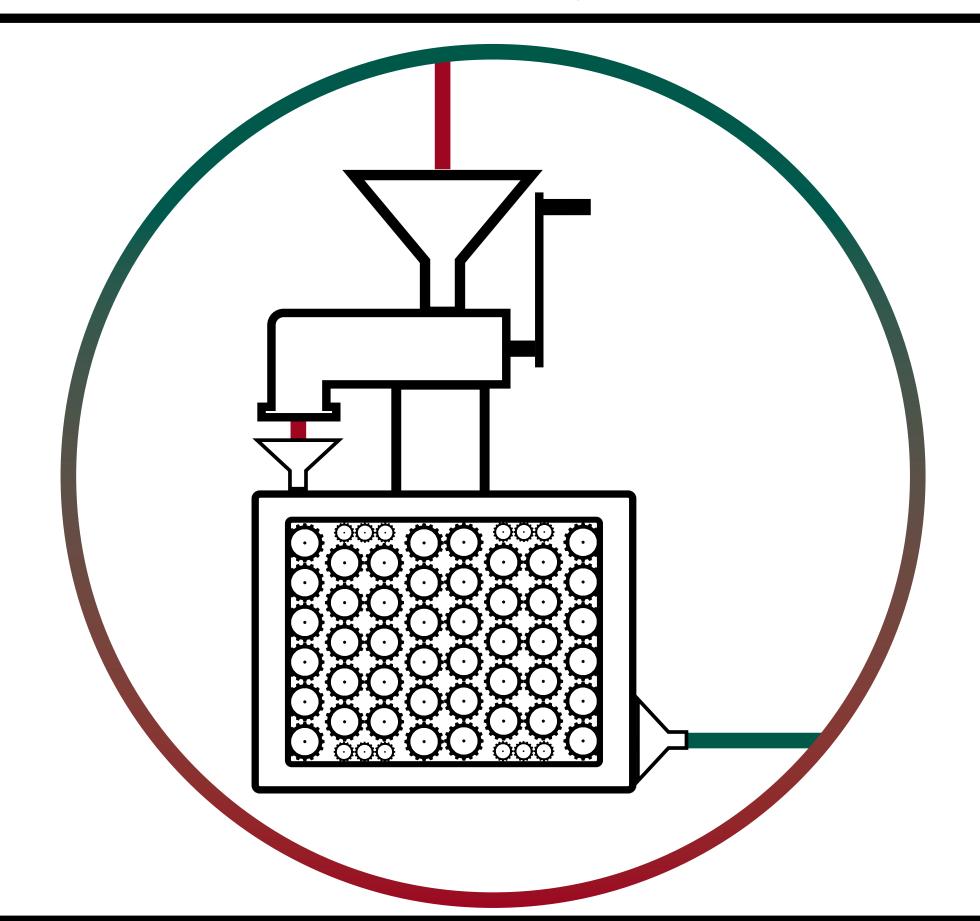
